

DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY
*** COCONINO COUNTY CAMPBELL AVENUE FLOODING ***

WHEREAS, on September 13, 2011, a powerful seasonal monsoon rain passed over areas in Coconino County that were severely burned by the Schultz Fire; and

WHEREAS, the heavy rains resulted in significant flooding and debris flow which caused significant damage to several major roads in the Timberline, Hutchison Acres and Wupatki Trails areas; and

WHEREAS, the debris and heavy sediment flow also damaged several portions of the Lower Campbell Avenue, as well as other areas that were impacted during a summer 2010 declared emergency and are subject to repeated damage from floods off the Schultz Fire burn areas; and

WHEREAS, the flooding threatened lives in the area and the County Sheriff's office was mobilized to close impacted roads and mobilize Search and Rescue to be on standby; and

WHEREAS, the Coconino County Board of Supervisors have declared a State of Emergency for their County for the flooding and condition of critical infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the Governor is authorized to declare an emergency pursuant to A.R.S. § 26-303(D); and

WHEREAS, the Legislature has authorized the expenditure of funds in an event of an emergency pursuant to A.R.S. § 35-192.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Janice K. Brewer, Governor of the State of Arizona, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the State, do hereby determine that the flooding event in northern Coconino County justifies a declaration of a State of Emergency, pursuant to A.R.S. § 26-303(D), and I do hereby:

- a. Declare that a State of Emergency exists in Coconino County due to flooding, effective September 13, 2011; and
- b. Direct that the sum of \$200,000 from the General Fund be made available to the Director of the Arizona Division of Emergency Management to be expended in accordance with A.R.S. § 35-192, A.A.C. R8-2-301 to 321, and Executive Order 79-4; and
- c. Direct that the State of Arizona Emergency Response and Recovery Plan be used to direct and control state and other assets and authorize the Director of the Arizona Division of Emergency Management to coordinate state assets.
