**Federal District Court Grants State's Motion to Dismiss
Challenge to SB1070**

*League of United Latin American Citizens v. State of Arizona Dismissed for Lack of
Standing*

PHOENIX – Governor Jan Brewer today announced yet another dismissal of a case challenging SB1070. Federal U.S. District Court Judge Susan Bolton granted the State's Motion to Dismiss in the case filed by the League of United Latin American Citizens (LULAC) against the State of Arizona. In today's order, Judge Bolton agreed with the Governor that the plaintiff's challenge lacked standing to pursue its claims and failed in proving to establish any real and immediate threat of harm.

"As I stated the day I signed SB1070, I believe Arizona, like America, is governed by laws," said Governor Brewer. "Good, well-intentioned laws, that confer respect and that demand respect in return. Without the rule of law and respect for those around you, this country would collapse. I am pleased and encouraged by Judge Bolton's decision today and look forward to victory in all legal challenges regarding SB1070."

The Support Our Law Enforcement and Safe Neighborhoods Act strengthens the laws of the State of Arizona and mirrors existing federal laws. Of the eight federal lawsuits against the State of Arizona, six have now been entirely dismissed. Portions of the remaining two lawsuits have also been dismissed. The Obama Administration's lawsuit against the State of Arizona on portions of SB 1070 remains at the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals.
