FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY

- Balances the budget and eliminates the structural deficit – first structural balance since 2007
- Pays down debt/deferrals from Great Recession in FY16– Universities \$200M, Department of Economic Security \$21M, and Department of Child Safety \$11M
- \$8M small business tax cut
- Responsibly budgets to allow for other tax cuts & fiscal impact with \$18M cushion
- Ongoing spending growth is 1.2%, less than the 2.9% population plus inflation growth projected in FY 2017
- 58% of the new FY 2017 spending is one time.

EDUCATION

- K-12 funding settlement adds \$3.5B over 10 years
- Special legislative session added \$224M to the K-12 base in FY 2016 – \$172M from the State Land Trust and \$52.4M from the General Fund
- \$181.4M in new K-12 funding beyond increases from the settlement:
 - » \$60M for enrollment, inflation and other adjustments
 - » \$53.6M for public school capital improvement
 - » \$29M for JTED base support with an ongoing commitment
 - » \$31M increase to base school funding to help with transition to current-year funding
 - » \$6.5M for the multi-site charter small school weight
 - » \$1.2M to delay District Sponsored Charter Schools reduction
 - » \$100,000 for a Geography Literacy initiative
- New credit enhancement program will increase the credit rating for public school construction projects, saving schools and taxpayers millions
- \$37M to Universities in FY17 beyond eliminating the \$200M deferral and a further adjustment of \$4M in FY16:
- \$705M in state support to universities. Universities will have \$5.7B in total funds

CHILD AND PUBLIC SAFETY

- New \$116M two-year investment in child safety
- DCS benchmarks commit to the resolution of the backlog by the end of FY 2017 and a significant reduction in the out-of-home population over the next two years
- Brings total child safety spending to \$974M in FY17
- Focus on safely reducing the growth rate of children in state care
- \$3M increase to eliminate court delays in child welfare dependency cases
- \$22.6M General Fund and \$4M in other funds to expand the border strike force, targeting illegal drug trafficking
- \$1.6M in other funds to open 100-bed community corrections center, to reduce recidivism

GOVERNMENT THAT WORKS

- \$10M for a new veterans' home in Flagstaff
- \$2M General Fund and \$450,000 in other funds to help over a thousand people with disabilities get off the waitlist for vocational rehabilitative services.
- Savings captured from common sense consolidations, including the elimination of the Department of Weights and Measures and the consolidation of Department of Fire, Building and Life Safety into other agencies.
- \$15M in strategic IT investments, modernizing State government
- \$387,500 to implement new wildland-firefighting procedures and improve safety
- \$4.2M for state building renovations that will allow the state to sell off under-utilized buildings
