53rd Legislature – 2nd Regular Session

As of **Day 27** of the session, <u>1,059</u> bills posted and <u>100</u> Memorials or Resolutions posted; two passed. See the link to the tracked bills for information on hearings this week and latest actions.

Deadlines: February 5 is the last day for introduction of bills in the House. **February 16** is the last day to hear Senate Bills in the Senate and last day to hear House Bills in the House.

Updates on a couple of bills being tracked by the Council

HB2324: community health workers; voluntary certification – DHS is required to adopt rules relating to the establishment and administration of a voluntary process for the certification of "community health workers" that includes a list of criteria. Establishes disciplinary action for certificate holders and other penalties for violations. Establishes a nine-member Community Health Workers Advisory Board within the Department to make recommendations to the Department regarding the community health worker requirements, competencies and standards.

S.2227 EMPOWER Care Act

Ensuring Medicaid Provides Opportunities for Widespread Equity, Resources, and Care Act

Introduced on 12/13/2017 by Senator Rob Portman (R-OH) Cosponsor Senator Maria Cantwell (D-WA)

Reauthorizes the Money Follows the Person Demonstration Program – State strategies for transitioning beneficiaries from institutional to qualified community settings. Beneficiaries are aged, physically disabled, intellectually or developmentally disabled or individuals with serious mental illnesses and other targeted waiver beneficiary populations.

Updates

From the **Elder Justice Coalition**

On Monday, January 29, H.R. 3758, the Senior Safe Act of 2017 passed the House of

Representatives. Sponsored by Reps. Kyrsten Sinema and Bruce Poliquin, the bill:

- encourages individuals and financial institutions to report suspected instances of elder fraud, exploitation and financial abuse
- incentivizes firms to train their employees to spot and stop financial fraud
- enables financial services providers (including banks, credit unions, investment advisors, and brokers) to better communicate with law enforcement agencies when they suspect financial fraud and/or exploitation
- grants immunity to those who report suspected abuse to regulators and law enforcement authorities

Sen. Susan Collins has sponsored the Senior\$afe Act in the Senate which has **been** rolled into **other legislation**. This new bill has passed the Banking Committee and is now awaiting a vote in the full Senate
