53rd Legislature – 2nd Regular Session

As of Day 57 of the session, <u>1,165</u> bills posted; 2 passed; 2 signed; <u>116</u> Memorials or Resolutions posted; 4 passed.

S.1091 Supporting Grandparents Raising Grandchildren Act

Introduced on 5/10/2017 by Senator Susan M. Collins (ME)

The bill establishes a Federal Task Force to Support Grandparents Raising Grandchildren. The task force shall identify, promote, coordinate, and publicly disseminate information and resources to help grandparents or other relatives meet the needs of children in their care and maintain their own health and emotional well-being. The task force terminates after five years.

Congress Continues to Work on Omnibus Funding Package Before March 23rd Deadline Last month, Congress reached an agreement on new higher spending limits for discretionary programs in FY18 and FY19 as part of the **Bipartisan Budget Act of 2018**(BBA of 2018). The next step is to pass appropriations under those new spending limits or another continuing resolution (CR) before the current continuing resolution expires on March 23rd. Most likely, Congress will craft an omnibus funding package for the remainder of FY18.
