WHEREAS, Raymond Weeks received the Presidential Citizens Medal from President Reagan in November 1982 with Weeks' local parade and ceremonies becoming an annual event celebrated nationwide; and

WHEREAS, Arizona is home to more than half a million military veterans who help to shape the American character by giving us a legacy of patriotism and honor; and

WHEREAS, the State of Arizona recognizes the role of United States military veterans and commemorates the sacrifices made and valor displayed by all.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Douglas A. Ducey, Governor of the State of Arizona, do hereby proclaim November 11, 2022 as

ARIZONA VETERANS DAY

and call on our citizens to take time to express gratitude to those whose service is a constant reminder of the high price of liberty.
