WHITE HOUSE PROPOSES STATE OR REGIONAL GATING CRITERIA

FLEXIBILITY FOR STATES TO TAILOR APPLICATION OF THESE CRITERIA TO LOCAL CIRCUMSTANCES

SYMPTOMS

Downward trajectory of influenza-like illnesses (ILI) reported within a 14-day period

AND

Downward trajectory of Covid-like syndromic cases reported within a 14-day period

CASES

Downward trajectory of documented cases within a 14-day period

OR

Downward trajectory of positive tests as a percent of total tests within a 14-day period

HOSPITALS

Treat all patients without crisis care.

AND

Robust testing program in place for at-risk healthcare workers, including emerging antibody testing

PHASED APPROACH

BASED ON **UP-TO-DATE DATA** AND READINESS

MITIGATES RISK OF RESURGENCE

PROTECTS THE MOST VULNERABLE

IMPLEMENTABLE ON **STATEWIDE OR COUNTY-BY-COUNTY** BASIS AT GOVERNOR'S DISCRETION

GUIDELINES FOR ALL PHASES: INDIVIDUALS

CONTINUE TO PRACTICE GOOD HYGIENE

- ✓ Wash your hands with soap and water or use hand sanitizer, especially after touching frequently used items or surfaces.
- ✓ Avoid touching your face.
- ✓ Sneeze or cough into a tissue, or the inside of your elbow.
- ✓ Disinfect frequently used items and surfaces as much as possible.
- ✓ Strongly consider using face coverings while in public, and particularly when using mass transit.

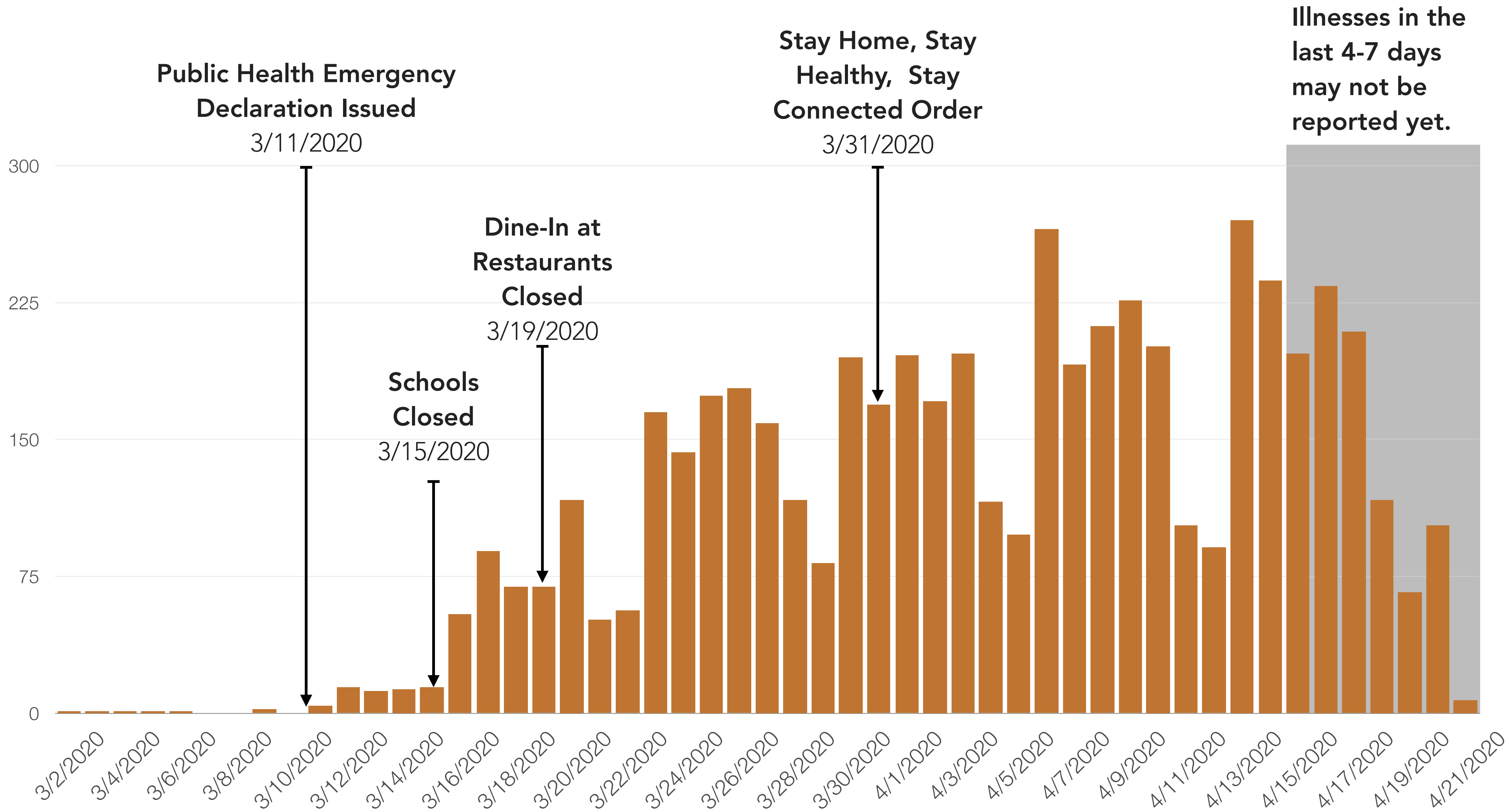
PEOPLE WHO FEEL SICK SHOULD STAY HOME

COVID-19 CASES BY DAY

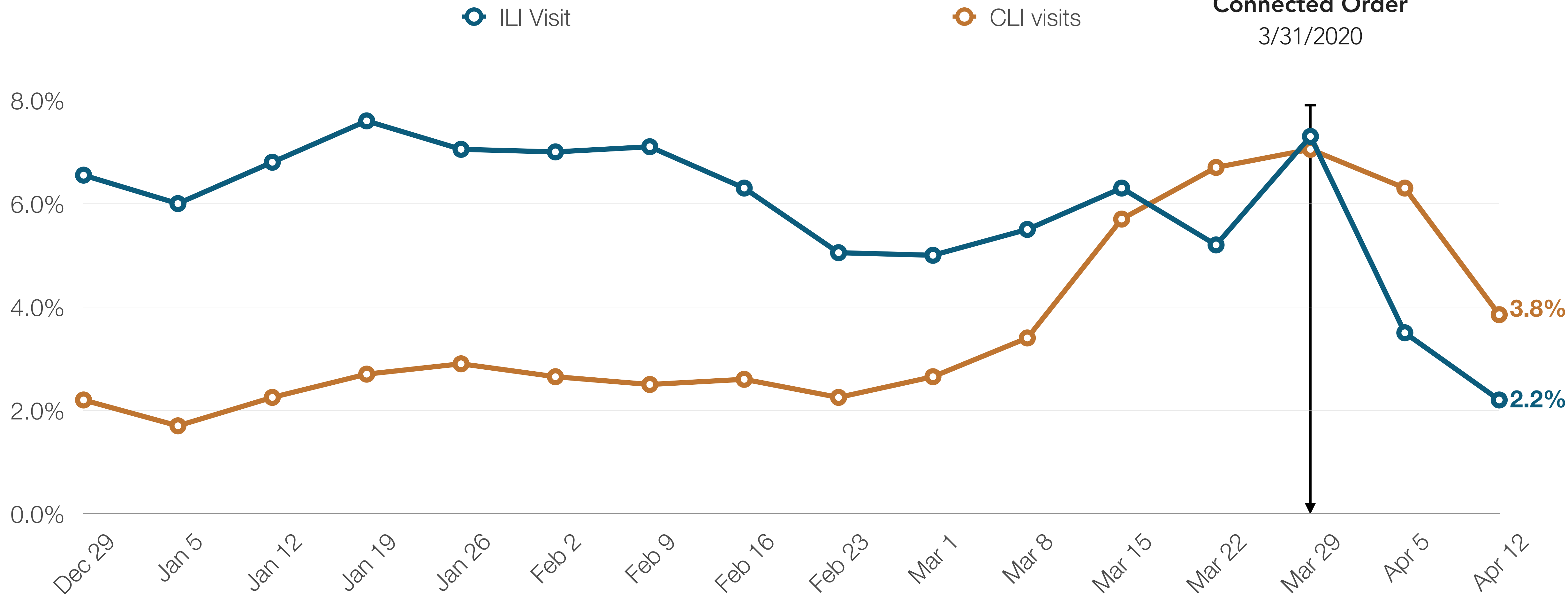
First Case of

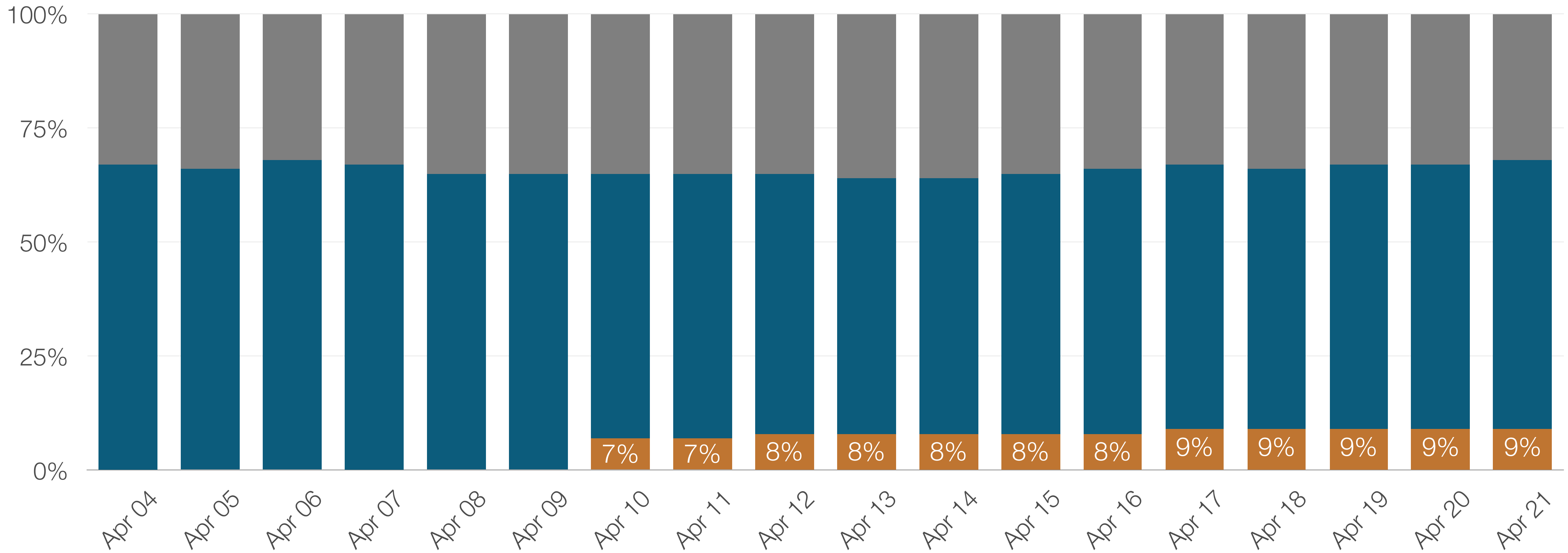
COVID-LIKE-ILLNESS (CLI) SURVEILLANCE

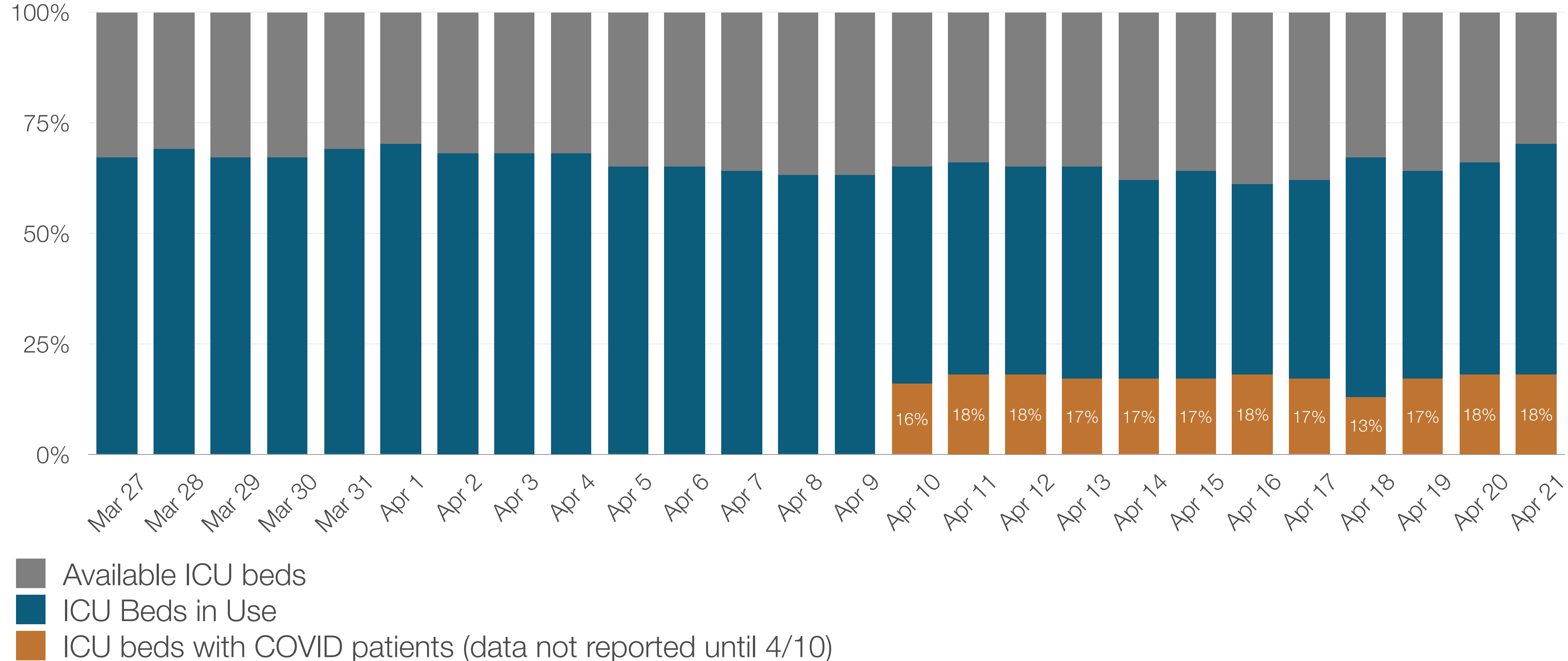


HOSPITAL BEDS

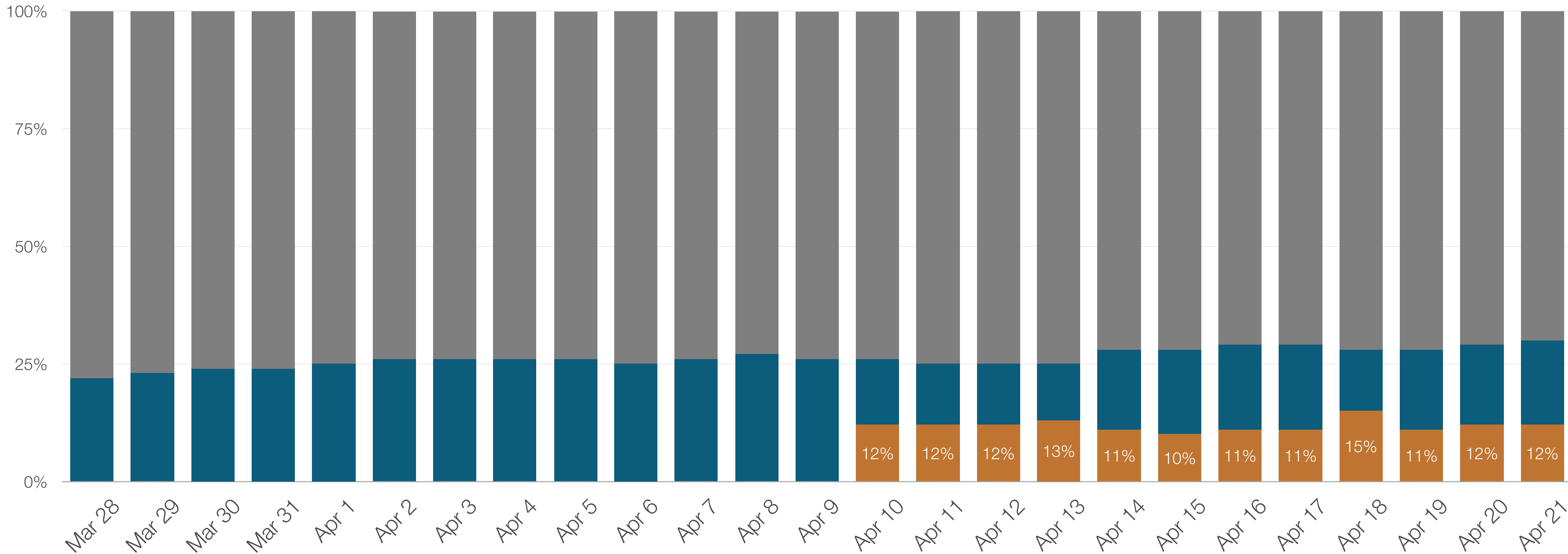

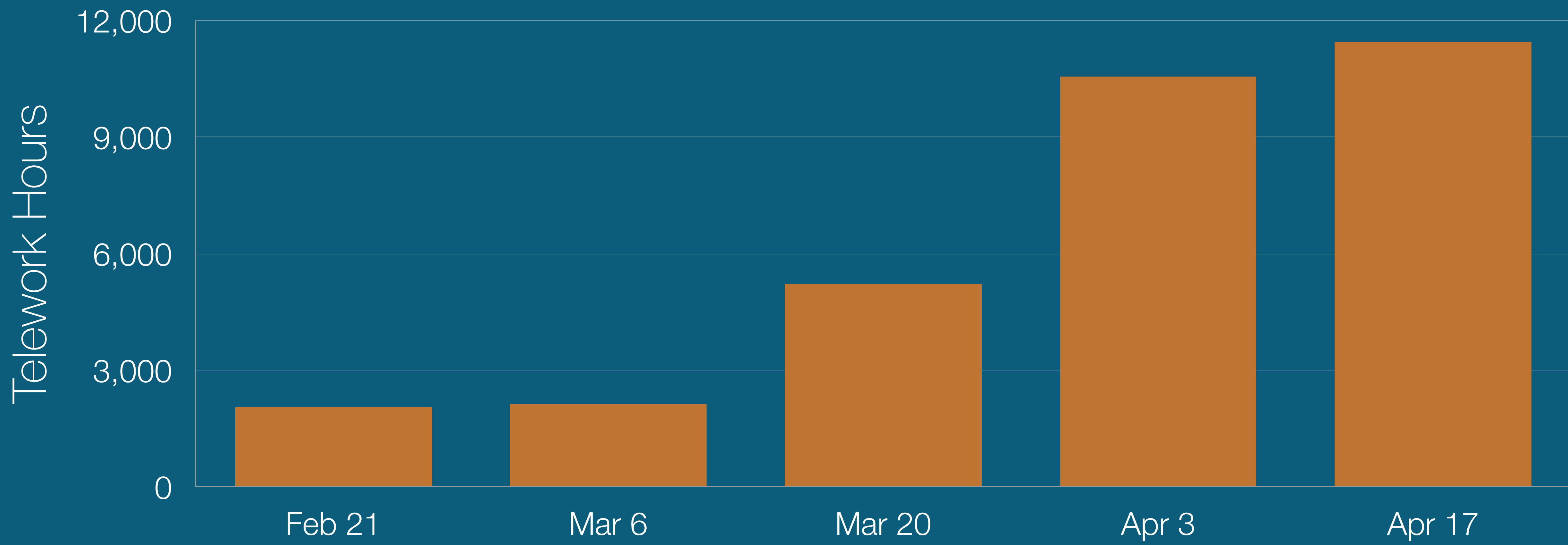

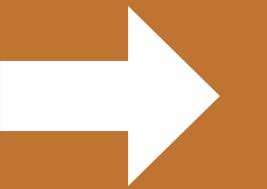

ELECTIVE SURGERIES

Last week, hospitals have asked for authorization to resume elective surgeries.

Today, I'm issuing an Executive Order, authorizing hospitals and outpatient surgical centers who can demonstrate adequate capacity, to resume elective surgeries beginning May 1st.

DIAGNOSTIC TESTING

This testing will detect if you're positive at the time of the test.

Moving Forward

Plans to expand testing to broader populations, beyond just first responders and our most vulnerable.

ANTIBODY TESTING

This testing can determine if someone has been exposed to the virus, had COVID-19 and recovered.

University of Arizona

Partnered with University of Arizona to administer testing for 250,000 Arizonans.

We're announcing a partnership with Sonora Quest to launch COVID-19 antibody testing.

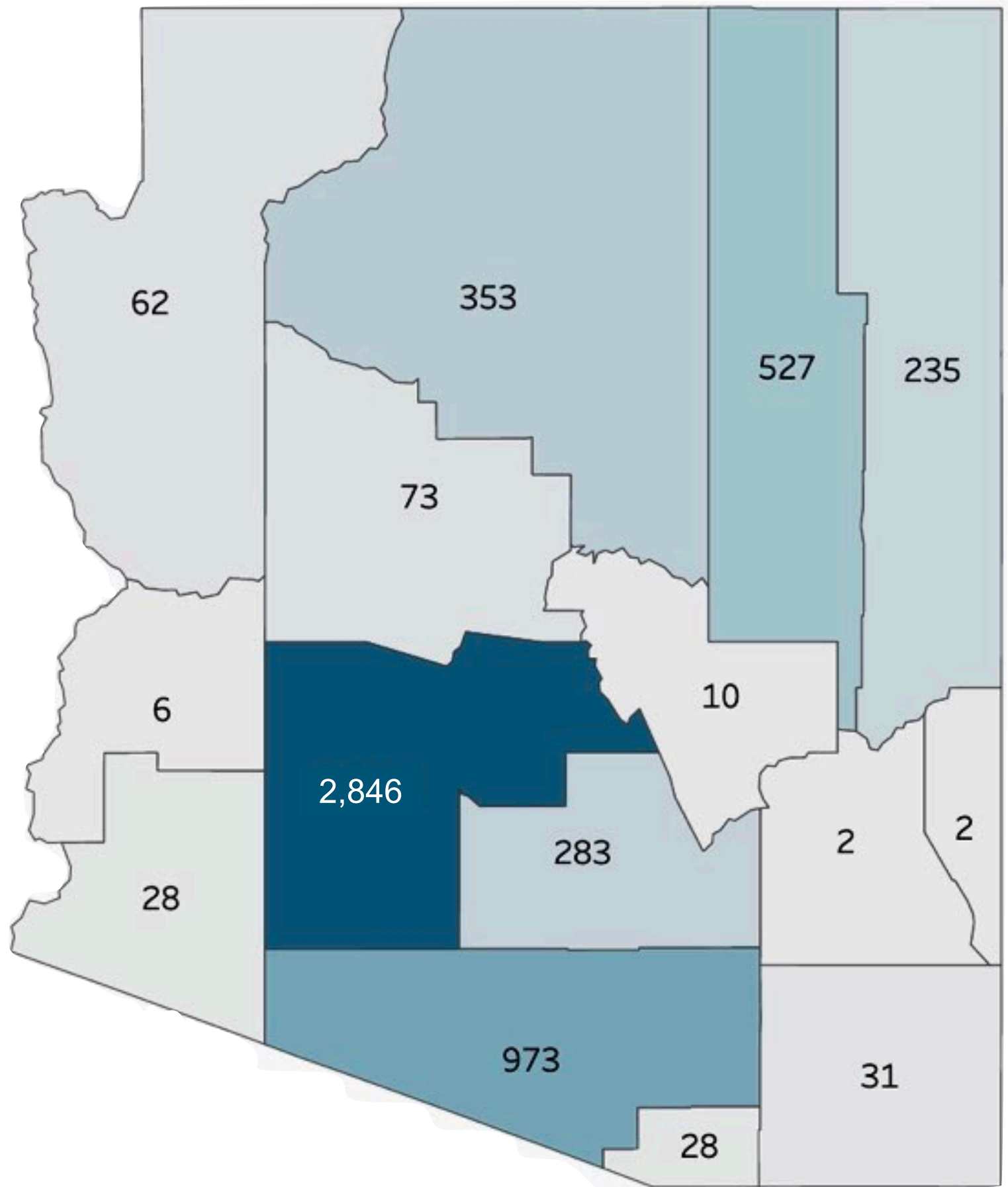
