INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING HIGHLIGHTS

- **\$321 million total investment** in transportation infrastructure in the FY 2022 budget
- Between the FY 2022 budget and Governor Ducey’s investments in infrastructure earlier this year, Arizona is adding **more than half a billion dollars** in transportation infrastructure investments

REBUILDING ROADS

- **\$90 million** for pavement preservation projects outside of Maricopa and Pima County on roads with a poor/fair rating
- **\$46.7 million** to repave portions of State Route 95 in Mohave County
- **\$13.6 million** to repave portions of State Route 77 in Oro Valley, Pima County
- **\$10.6 million** to repave portions of State Route 90 in Cochise County
- **\$4.7 million** to repave portions of State Route 69 in Yavapai County
- **\$3.5 million** to repair Main Street portions of State Route 186 and State Route 10 in Willcox, Cochise County
- **\$1.2 million** for improvements on the Hill Street Corridor in Globe, Gila County
- **\$1 million** to help reconstruct 20th Avenue in Safford, Graham County
- **\$1 million** to replace the Butte Avenue bridge in Florence, Pinal County
- **\$700,000** for vegetation and design studies of State Route 88 in Maricopa and Gila Counties
- **\$560,000** to repair Main Street roadways in Jerome, Yavapai County

EXPANDING TRANSPORTATION CAPACITY AND SAFETY

- **\$50 million** to continue widening Interstate 10 between Phoenix and Tucson
- **\$25 million** to construct an overpass at State Route 347 and Riggs Road in Pinal County and reduce crashes in this area
 - **\$7.5 million** to finalize design of State Route 347 and Riggs Road project
 - **\$2.5 million** to finalize studies of State Route 347 and Riggs Road project
- **\$18 million** to replenish the State Aviation Fund that helps fund infrastructure improvements at airports throughout Arizona
- **\$10 million** to expand State Route 95 near the Yuma Proving Grounds
- **\$8.5 million** to widen portions of 67th Avenue in Peoria and improve drainage
- **\$8 million** to widen portions of Camelback Road in Goodyear
- **\$7.9 million** to construct a bridge and extend Ocotillo Road in Gilbert
- **\$5 million** to improve Tangerine Road near Interstate 10 in Marana
- **\$4 million** to study a potential north-south corridor transportation project in Pinal County
- **\$750,000** for improvements to State Route 87 in Pinal County
- **\$150,000** to study potential expansions of on- and off-ramps at Grand Ave and Loop 303 intersection in Maricopa County
- **\$140,000** to study safety issues and potential improvements to State Route 377 in Navajo County
