



PUBLIC SAFETY

TOTAL FUNDING: \$1.5 BILLION

BORDER SECURITY

- **\$25 million** to provide funding for the Arizona National Guard’s border security mission
- **\$30 million** to assist county and local law enforcement agencies with border security costs, in addition to the existing state support for the Border Strike Force mission

PUBLIC SAFETY

- **\$23.5 million** to provide State Troopers with 10% pay raises
- **\$13.8 million** to equip all State Troopers with body cameras
- **\$6.6 million** to fund overtime costs at the Department of Public Safety
- **\$400,000** to increase recruitment initiatives at the Department of Public Safety
- **\$165 million** to fund non-medical behavioral health services
- **\$1 billion** to pay down Public Safety Personnel Retirement System (PSPRS) and Correctional Officer Retirement Plan (CORP) pension debt
 - \$500 million to pay down Department of Public Safety PSPRS pension debt
 - \$500 million to pay down Department of Corrections, Rehabilitation and Reentry CORP pension debt

CORRECTIONS, REHABILITATION AND REENTRY

- **\$30.7 million** to provide Correctional Officers with 5% pay raises
- **\$11 million** to expand county-level reentry and recidivism reduction programs providing treatment to individuals in need
- **\$1.6 million** to provide Youth Correctional Officers with 5% pay raises
- **\$1.6 million** to create a new Corporal position at the Department of Corrections, Rehabilitation and Reentry
- **\$5 million** to expand substance abuse treatment programs for inmates at state prisons
- **\$22.2 million** to fully fund building renewal to maintain facilities and infrastructure at state prisons
- **\$18.7 million** to continue the phased and orderly closure of Arizona State Prison Complex-Florence
- **\$1.3 million** to establish a Mental Health Transition Pilot Program for up to 500 inmates
- **\$28 million** to increase rates for contracted providers of correctional services
- **\$25.6 million** to repair critical fire systems and door systems at Arizona State Prison Complex-Eyman
- **\$17.3 million** to replace radios for Correctional Officers
- **\$3.9 million** to issue stab vests to all Correctional Officers
- **\$15 million** to augment medical staffing at state prisons

CYBERSECURITY AND HOMELAND SECURITY

- **\$500,000** to fund full-time staffing for a operational cyber response team to prevent, respond to and recover from cyber threats
- **\$300,000** to boost the National Guard cyber response revolving fund to respond to cybersecurity emergencies
- **\$200,000** to provide high-quality imaging equipment for emergency incident response, such as wildfires or search and rescue missions, at the Department of Emergency and Military Affairs
