





COVID-19 CASES BY DAY




PERCENTAGE OF POSITIVE TESTS




HOSPITAL BEDS FOR COVID-19

DOES NOT INCLUDE 2,600 ADDITIONAL SURGE BEDS




INTENSIVE CARE UNIT HOSPITAL BEDS FOR COVID-19

VENTILATORS FOR COVID-19












HOW THE NUMBER OF CASES HAS CHANGED OVER THE LAST WEEK







EXPANDING TESTING

PROJECT CATAPULT

- Partnership between Sonora Quest Laboratories, Euroimmun/PerkinElmer, and ADHS
- Sonora Quest expects to exponentially increase their ability to process tests. process 35,000 diagnostic tests per day by the end of July, and up to 60,000 tests per day by the end of August.

35,000 tests BY THE END OF JULY

60,000 tests BY THE END OF AUGUST

EXPANDING TESTING IN PARTNERSHIP WITH CDC

- Partnering with CDC/HHS to offer free COVID-19 testing
- Up to 5,000 tests per day
- 2 sites: Maryvale and South Phoenix
- 12 days of surge testing

EXPANDING TESTING IN PARTNERSHIP WITH ASU

- ADHS is partnering with ASU to provide free saliva-based COVID-19 testing to the community
- Need to pre-register for an appointment
- First drive-through: Saturday, July 11 in the West Valley
- Will add additional sites and days
- Ongoing over the next couple of months

SAFER AT HOME: QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER BEFORE GOING OUT

- How many people will you interact with?
- Can you keep 6 feet of space between you and others? Will you be outdoors or indoors?
- What's the length of time that you will be interacting with people?

HOSPITAL RESOURCES

STAFFING INITIATIVE

- Arizona Surge Line will be administering the Staffing
- Offer support to staff total licensed beds (up to 20%)
- Nursing resources for hospitals that participate in the Arizona Surge Line
- Currently taking applications

POST ACUTE SOLUTIONS

- Working with providers across the state to increase post acute opportunities.
- Expanding the number of providers who participate in the PACCT dashboard.
- Including, providing incentive dollars to facilities who agree to take post-acute COVID-19 patients for:
 - Increased staffing
 - Purchase PPE
 - Develop infection control policies and procedures
